### **Willow Class (Reception, Year 1 and 2)**

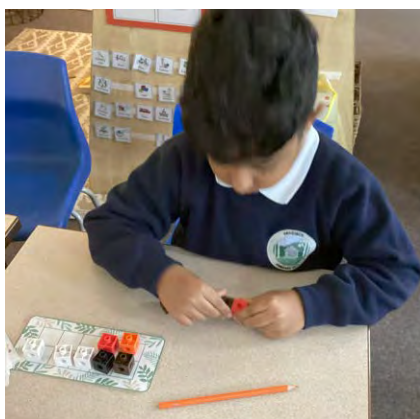
We have had a super first Summer term in Willow Class! Our reception children have made a super start settling in to Laycock Primary School and they have been welcomed by all children in school. We have done lots of exploring both inside and outside of the classroom. We loved inviting the parents in to watch our phonics lesson and hope you are enjoying practising sounds at home.





We are very excited that Ludic is back to share quality time with families at home. We can't wait to see what adventures he goes on.

We have done lots of lovely writing and reading different stories as part of our English lessons. These stories have included 'In Every Street, In Every House' and 'The Building Boy'. In Maths, we have been securing our understanding of numbers up to 20.



All the Reception children are making fantastic progress in Phonics, and we are really enjoying reading books both in the classroom and at home. Our Year ½ children have loved spending time outside reading too!



Our Year 1/2 children have been working incredibly hard in their science learning this half term. We have been learning all about our bodies and our 5 senses. We have been practising naming our different body parts and testing our different senses. We have had a lot of fun!





We had the best time playing with our scrap shed resources! As part of the OPAL (outdoor play and learning) programme we have been exploring different ways to make our outdoor learning fun! We did lots of den building activities and role play.

### Maple Class (Year 3 and 4)

We have had a brilliant first half term in Maple class! This half term, Year 3 have enjoyed taking part in Forest Schools sessions. They have enjoyed learning to make fires, enjoyed craft activities, ate marshmallows and drank hot chocolate that was cooked on a fire that they created.





In Geography, Maple class have been learning about Antarctica. We found out about the climate and physical features of Antarctica. We learned about Ernest Shackleton's Antarctica expedition and designed our own expedition around our school grounds.

### **Cherry Class (Year 5 and 6)**

What a positive start to our time in Cherry class! The children have taken their responsibilities as leaders of the school very seriously and are excellent role models for the younger years. We have engaged with a number of adults in our community (police officers, the fire brigade, residential leaders) and the feedback has always been praise for such a ' lovely group of children, who are polite, respectful and enthusiastic in their learning and with others.'

We have been inspired by our class texts this half term: The Highwayman and The Boy at the Back of the Class. During our writing unit, we have learnt about literary devices such as metaphors and then created our own stanzas incorporating these. The class have been enthralled by the texts and have enjoyed acting out key scenes and creating dramatic artwork as well as tasting pomegranate seeds - our favourite time of the week is when we listen to a section of the class texts!







Being outdoors and challenging ourselves has been a definite highlight with our residential trip for Year 6s and our long walk to Ilkley Moor, whilst Year 5 are enjoying their forest school sessions and especially sawing wood! The children worked together as a team when using the Scrap Shed resources and it was lovely to watch them playing and problem solving together as a group.

We have just come to the end of the first module - 'Meet Your Brain' in the myHappyMind programme.

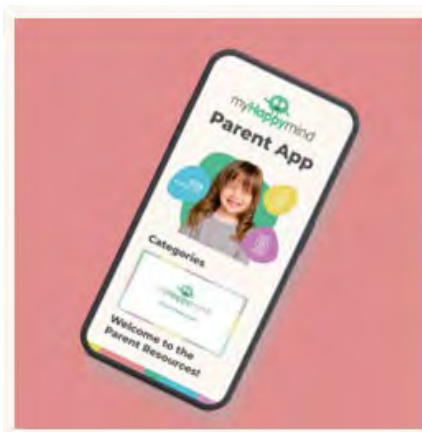
We have learnt:


**You asked:** for us to make links with the local church again so that we can hold our Christmas carol concert there.
