At Laycock Primary School we uphold, promote and teach pupils about the British Values as directed under new Ofsted guidance, September 2014 v4, para 165:

'Ensure that [governors] and the school promote tolerance of and respect for people of all faiths (or those of no faith), cultures and lifestyles; and support and help, through their words, actions and influence within the school and more widely in the community, to prepare children and young people positively for life in modern Britain'
