Science - Rocks and Soils:

Children will learn to:

- Sort and describe natural and man-made materials found on Earth
- Explain what The Earth is made of and describe the layers of The Earth
- Classify rocks and learn about igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks
- Explain how fossils are formed and learn who Mary Anning was
- Investigate the permeability of soil

Geography:

Children will learn to:

- Explain what causes volcanoes to erupt
- Explain why earthquakes happen
- Describe what happens when a tsunami hits land
- Suggest why weather is becoming more extreme around the world
- Pinpoint parts of the world where natural disasters are frequent
- Consider the devastation left behind after natural disasters
- Study the impact that humans have had on Earth
- Suggest ways that we can alter our behaviour to improve the environment
